We are living in an age of overlapping emergencies: the global order is disintegrating, climate change is a reality in the here and now, and the threat of a renewed pandemic remains with us. For the global economy, this means that supply disruptions have become a new normal. The war in Iran is a stark reminder that when shocks hit essentials for human livelihoods and production they can unleash sellers' inflation which brings about a redistribution from the bottom to the top. Those with the least capacity to absorb the shock carry the largest burden, while the wealthiest reap windfall profits.

In this workshop, Isabella Weber will present policy implications of inflation and concrete policy proposals. Following the presentation, there will be a panel discussion with Werner Raza (ÖFSE) and Melanie Pichler (BOKU). The workshop will be moderated by Florian Weiler (CEU) and is part of the Vienna Karl Polanyi Visiting Professorship of Isabella Weber.
